EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC ORDER 2020

NOTICE IS GIVEN that under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Secretary of State has extended the order made by Lake District National Park Authority. The effect of the order is to prohibit all public traffic for all purposes from proceeding over Footpath 201023 at Newlands Beck, south of Little Braithwaite, Above Derwent Parish, between grid references NY 2386 2299 (Little Braithwaite) and NY 2383 2192, because of danger to the public from the collapsed and eroding riverbank.

The Order came into effect on 18 February 2020 and has now been further extended until 30 June 2027, or until the completion of actions to resolve the safety issues, whichever is earlier. We intend to make a diversion order to resolve this issue. Meanwhile, please use alternative routes following public roads to the east or west and other footpaths, which can be seen on the map.

The notice and plan showing the route concerned may be inspected during normal office or opening hours at the National Park Authority Offices, Murley Moss, Oxenholme Road, Kendal, LA9 7RL; and at Allerdale Borough Council, Allerdale House, New Bridge Road, Workington, CA14 3YJ; and is also available online at www.lakedistrict.gov.uk/rowclosures

If the path has not been made safe by 30 June 2027, the order may be extended for a further period with the approval of the Secretary of State.

TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC ORDER 2020

WHEREAS the Lake District National Park Authority (hereinafter referred to as “the Authority”) being the Agent for Cumbria County Council for Footpath 201023 at Newlands Beck, south of Little Braithwaite, Above Derwent, is satisfied that all public traffic on the said highway should be prohibited danger to the public from collapsed and collapsing riverbank.

NOW THEREFORE the Authority in exercise of the powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and all other powers enabling them in that behalf **HEREBY MAKE** the following order:

- 1 No public traffic shall proceed along that section of Footpath number 201023 between grid references NY 2386 2299 (Little Braithwaite) and NY 2383 2192, alongside the Newlands Beck in Above Derwent Parish.
- 2 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3 This order shall come into operation on 27 February 2020 and will continue in force for six months or until the works have been completed whichever is the earlier.
- 4 This order may be cited as the Lake District National Park Authority (Part of Footpath 201023, Newlands Beck, Little Braithwaite, Above Derwent Parish) Temporary Prohibition of Traffic Order 2020.

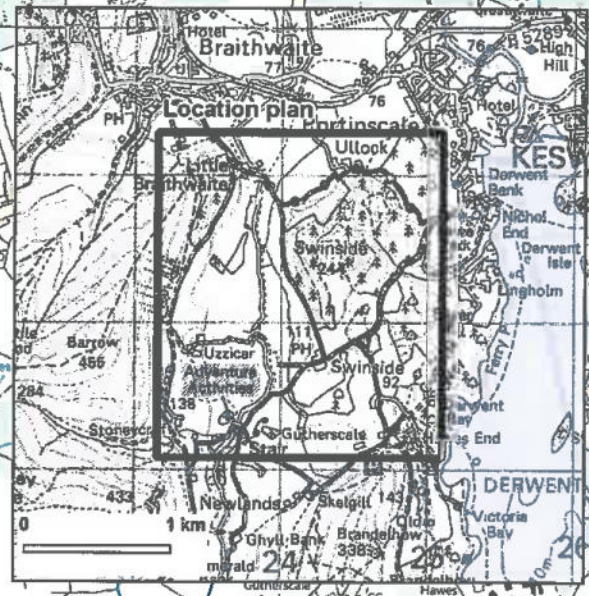
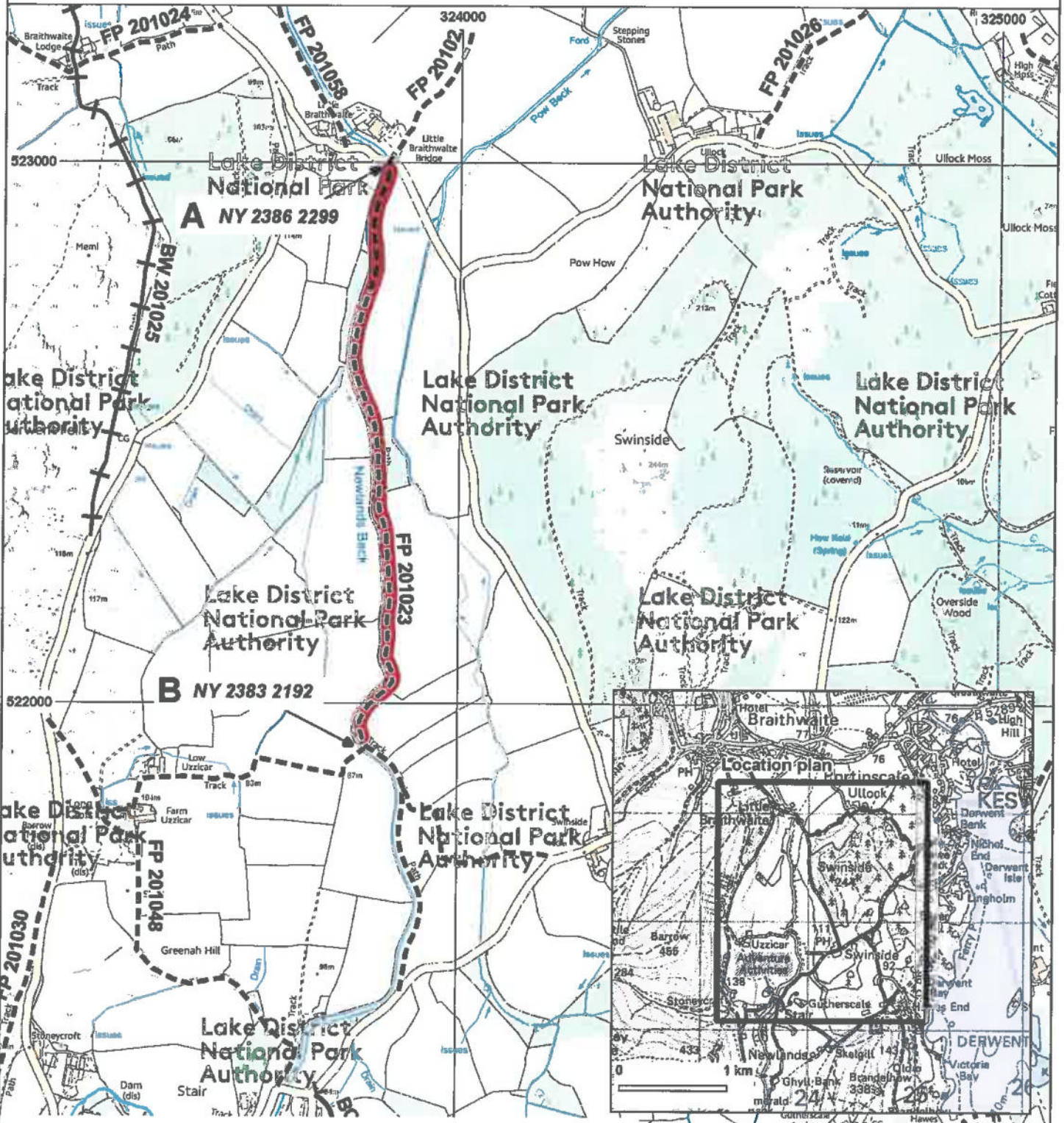


Temporary Traffic Regulation Order Part of Public Footpath 201023, alongside Newlands Beck, Little Braithwaite, Above Derwent Parish

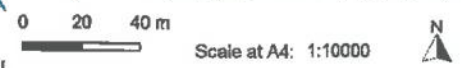
