



## **Delegated decisions on enforcement matters by the Head of Development Management acting under delegated authority**

In 2018/19 we received 334 complaints of alleged breaches of planning control. 44% of complaints related to matters that were not in breach. Often breaches of planning control are resolved without formal enforcement action - for example the owner or occupier may voluntarily remedy the breach. Sometimes it may be appropriate to regularise the breach with a retrospective permission. In some cases it may be necessary to take formal action. In other cases it may not be expedient to pursue formal action even though voluntary resolution or regularisation cannot be achieved.

### **Enforcement notices served**

#### **E/2025/0214, Land at South Barn, Ayside**

Planning permission was granted in 2019 for an agricultural building (application 7/2019/5661). The justification provided in the application was that the building was required for agricultural purposes – specifically to house alpaca which the landowner was keeping on the land, and to facilitate the landowner's stated intention (set out in a business plan) to develop their agricultural business further into breeding pedigree alpaca. Reflecting the terms on which planning permission was sought and granted, a condition was imposed requiring the building was removed if agricultural use ceased.

Following investigation we have identified that the land is now being used as a sawmill for commercial timber processing, for the fabrication of buildings and furniture, and for various storage. This is not agriculture and does not reflect the lawful use of the land nor the permission granted. A material change of use and a

breach of the conditions on the planning permission previously granted has occurred.

The breaches impact the character and appearance of the area, and could adversely impact the amenity of neighbouring dwellings now and in the future. We issued two enforcement notices on 3 December 2025. The purpose of the notices is to remedy the breaches of planning control.

### **E/2025/0241, Land at Eskdale Vicarage, Boot**

Eskdale Vicarage is lawfully a large single dwellinghouse. However, the property has been advertised and occupied as short-term holiday letting accommodation which sleeps up to 16 people. This is a material change of use and breach of planning control.

Policies 15 and 18 are weighted in favour of retaining permanent residential dwellinghouses irrespective of their size, affordability and occupation restrictions. The loss of this dwellinghouse to short-term holiday letting accommodation does not help to sustain vibrant communities and result in the loss of a property suitable for providing local need housing. An enforcement notice was issued 15 January 2026. The notice requires use of the land as short-term letting accommodation to be discontinued.

### **Investigations closed**

#### **E/2019/0053, Ridding Bay, Lakeside, Ulverston, LA12 8AU**

Alleged change of use of agricultural land to domestic garden, including re-profiling ground

Reason for closure: Breach - Retrospective permission

A concern was raised regarding the alleged change of use of land to domestic garden at Ridding Bay, Lakeside, Ulverston. Our investigation found that operational development had taken place to the south of the dwelling to form an extension to the

domestic garden. A breach of planning control had occurred. Retrospective planning permission for the development was subsequently sought and approved with conditions on 15 December 2025 (ref: 7/2025/5428). The breach of planning control has been resolved.

Breach resolved - retrospective permission granted.

**E/2019/0116, Land at Barber Green, Ayside, Grange-Over-Sands, LA11 6HU**

Alleged siting of agricultural waste, septic tank in field, untidy land, buildings etc residential occupation of land,

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

A large amount of agricultural machinery, equipment and other items, including a portakabin, caravan and shipping containers were moved onto this land. The caravan was initially being residentially occupied, but the residential use quickly stopped. An enforcement notice and a Section 215 untidy land notice were served to require the items to be removed from the land. Due to the personal circumstances of the landowners compliance with the notices took longer than required. The majority of items have now been removed and the notices have been substantially complied with. A single shipping container remains to provide secure storage for agricultural items and feed. It is not in the public interest to take further action to secure the removal of the container.

**E/2019/0122, Ullswater Yacht Club Ltd, Howtown, Penrith, CA10 2NA**

Alleged siting of storage containers, sheds, letting out of property to commercial operators and use of field for camping etc

Reason for closure: No Breach - Immune (S171B)

We received concerns about shipping containers, a new shed and use of the fields for camping and the hiring out of boats at Ullswater Yacht Club. Our investigations revealed that the shipping containers and shed had been in situ since at least 2014 so are immune from enforcement action (and would have been immune from action at the time the complaint was first received in 2019). The camping had planning permission or was covered by a Lawful Development Certificate. The hiring out of

water craft was not a material change of use given its scale and the lawful activity already taking place at the site.

**E/2019/0370, Becksid Farm, Whicham, Millom, LA18 5LU**

Alleged non-compliance with planning permission 7/2018/4127 (use of transparent roofing and erection of white plastic structure in valley)

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

We received concerns about an agricultural building having been constructed in breach of conditions that required the building to be in conformity with the approved plans and the roof to be covered in dark grey (anthracite) coloured sheeting. We found clear panels had been included in the roofing material. This was to allow natural daylight into the building to allow the safe operation of the milking parlour and reduce use of lights within the building during the daytime. However it also results in light spill during the hours of darkness. We have assessed the implications of the change in roofing material including light spill and consider it is not expedient in the public interest to take further action.

The concern also referred to a white structure in the field. This was found to be the temporary storage of animal feed that was covered with a white plastic sheet. The sheeting did not amount to development so there was no breach of planning control. In any event it has now been removed.

**E/2020/0007, Land at Blease Road, Threlkeld, Keswick**

Alleged unauthorised engineering operations/tipping

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

In late 2019 a scheme (7/2019/3134) for the development of eight houses was resolved to be approved by DCC subject to the signing of a S106 securing a section 106 agreement. In early 2020 works commenced on the development without permission which led to the serving of a Temporary Stop Notice and Enforcement Notice after dialogue failed to stop the works voluntarily. Eventually the housing development was granted consent, and the conditions were discharged. There is now no breach of planning control as the works have planning permission, have

been built in accordance with the planning permission and it appears that the land is back in agricultural use and reprofiled to either the approved permission levels or to those shown on the submitted photographs and approved plans.

**E/2021/0070, Barn to south of Low Barrow House, Brigsteer, Kendal, Cumbria, LA8 8AT**

Alleged barn conversion not in compliance with permission CU/2016/0006

Reason for closure: No Breach - Immune (S171B)

We received concerns that a barn conversion had been not carried out in accordance with plans. We visited and found that the works differed materially from what had been approved. The works as carried out are now immune from enforcement action as they were carried out over four years ago.

**E/2021/0087, Tods Lot, near Crook Hall, Crook, Kendal, Cumbria**

Alleged caravan

Reason for closure: No Breach - Not development

We received concerns about a caravan that had been sited on forestry land. Our investigations concluded that the caravan was used in connection with the lawful use of the land and there was no breach of planning control.

**E/2021/0110, High Ground, Staveley In Cartmel, Cumbria, LA12 8NH**

Alleged work not in accordance with planning permissions 7/2010/5581 or

7/2007/5643

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

We received concerns about development that may have taken place not in accordance with plans. There are some minor changes to the garage building as constructed – the development has not been built in accordance with the approved plans. This is a breach of planning control. However, given the location and positioning of the garage it was considered the works were acceptable on their planning merits and it was not expedient to take further action.

**E/2021/0115, Land to west of Dalegarth Hall Cottage, Eskdale**

Alleged shower block and road and use beyond 56 days

Reason for closure: Breach - Notice complied with

The use of the land as a pop-up campsite had taken place for longer than the permitted timeframe. This has resulted in a material change of use of the land from agricultural to a mixed use of agricultural and recreational campsite. Associated operational development consisting of a track, portaloos, a washing station and shower block had also been in place for more than two years - they were considered to be buildings and are unauthorised. A breach of planning control had occurred, had not accrued immunity from formal action, and there were no relevant planning permissions in place.

An Enforcement Notice was served which was appealed. The appeal was subsequently dismissed by an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. The Requirements of the notice have now been complied with. The breach of planning control has been resolved.

**E/2021/0126, Land to south of Beckside, Underbarrow, Cumbria**

Alleged tipping of waste

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

We received concerns about tipping on land that we had previously investigated. We visited and found that the tipping, though limited, was harmful and we wrote to the landowner who agreed to remove the tipped waste. We have revisited the site, and whilst not all the waste has been removed, it is reduced and has grassed over. It is not considered expedient to take any further action.

**E/2021/0167, Unit 1, Brantfell Place, Bowness-on-Windermere, LA23 3FJ**

Alleged use of building as commercial laundry and hiring of camper vans

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

We received concerns about the use of a business unit as a commercial laundry and campervan hire business. That use has ceased and the unit is now used in

accordance with the planning permission. The use ceased before we were able to conclude whether a breach of planning control had occurred or not, however if there had a breach it has now been resolved.

**E/2021/0242, Land at Ayside, LA11 6HY**

Alleged unauthorised bridge and new access

Reason for closure: No Breach - Immune (S171B)

We received concerns about works within an agricultural field in Ayside. Our initial visit established that works had been carried out without the necessary permission including culverting the beck. We subsequently received an application for two affordable dwellings that including culverting the beck as part of the application which the Development Control Committee resolved to approve on the 03 July 2024. Approval would resolve the breach of planning control. However, the planning obligation has not been signed and a decision notice has not yet been issued. The works are now immune from enforcement action by passage of time.

**E/2021/0262, Land at Blease Road, Threlkeld, Keswick, CA12 4SD**

Alleged unauthorised tipping/alteration of land levels

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

We received concern about waste being piled on agricultural land near a recently approved housing scheme. Our visits appear to show it was part of the housing site operations, and it would be permitted development. The housing site has now largely been finished (apart from landscaping) and the land appears to have been returned to agriculture with no visible waste present.

**E/2021/0279, Chestnut Road Garage, Chestnut Road, Windermere, LA23 2AL**

Alleged change of use of store building to auto body workshop. Installation of chimney

Reason for closure: No Breach - Immune (S171B)

A concern was raised regarding the alleged change of use of a store building to an autobody workshop, and the installation of chimney. Our investigation found that a

building was being used for the purposes of autobody repair and a chimney had been installed for the purposes of extraction in relation to paints and solvents used for vehicle spraying. The building has planning permission for uses falling within Use Class E (Commercial, business and service uses). The current use of the building falls within Use Class E therefore there is no breach of planning control.

The installation of the chimney required planning permission. No permission was sought or granted and therefore a breach of planning control occurred. However, the chimney was installed more than four years ago and is now immune from action.

### **E/2021/0301, Beech Cottage, Caldbeck, Wigton, CA7 8DU**

Alleged works to boundary wall, erection of structure in front garden, subdivision  
Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

A concern was raised regarding works to a boundary wall, subdivision and the erection of a garden building at Beech Cottage, Caldbeck. Our investigation found no evidence of a subdivision on the property. Works had taken place to a boundary wall to create a pedestrian access along with the installation of a gate. These works are permitted development under Part 2 Class A of The Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015.

A garden building has been erected on the land. The development does not benefit from permitted development rights, and no planning permission has been granted for the development. A breach of planning control has occurred.

However, it is not considered expedient to take action as the development is acceptable on its planning merits, does not materially affect the character of the area nor does it have an unacceptable impact of the amenity of nearby residents.

Breach - not expedient to enforce.

### **E/2021/0376, Units 1 & 2, Longlands Road, Bowness, LA23 3AS**

Conversion of light industrial unit into drinking establishment - Linked consultation request 7/2021/E0143

Reason for closure: No Breach - Not development

We received concerns about the way two units in Bowness were to be occupied. We have monitored the site and following a retrospective application for other unrelated matters we considered that there was no material change of use. There is no breach of planning control.

**E/2022/0034, St Pauls, Lindale, Grange Over Sands**

Alleged dereliction of listed building

Reason for closure: No Breach - Not development

Following an initial investigation, we concluded the listed building was not being properly preserved and was at risk of further decay. This in itself is not a breach of planning control, but lack of action to address the issue could result in the building being placed on the Heritage At Risk Register. Following discussion with the Diocese of Carlisle some progress was made to protect the building. The building has now been sold, and the new owners are seeking to change the use. We are confident the initial repairs will have stopped further deterioration until such time the new owners are able to undertake further works.

**E/2022/0106, Lake House, Lakeside, Ulverston, LA12 8AU**

Alleged construction of wall / steps in breach of conditions of planning permission

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

Hard and soft landscaping including steps, areas of hardstanding and a drystone wall were erected without the approval of details as required by condition 7 of permission 7/2021/5368. A breach of planning control had occurred. The owner was invited to submit a planning application to address the breach, this was submitted and subsequently approved. The breach of planning control has been resolved.

**E/2022/0214, Low House, Cleabarrow, Windermere, LA23 3NA**

Hardstanding and summer house

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

We received concerns about new buildings that had been erected in the longstanding garden of a domestic property. Our investigation revealed that the buildings would have required planning permission. Given the domestic context and the limited harm the development was considered acceptable and it was thought not expedient to take any further action.

**E/2022/0293, Rossett Holme, Compston Road, Ambleside, LA22 9DR**

Alleged unauthorised change of use to holiday let

Reason for closure: Other

We received concerns that a property which was shown to be controlled by local occupancy conditions had been converted to a holiday let. This was reported through our planning permissions with occupancy restrictions webmap. One of the shortfalls of the map it does not identify which permissions have been implemented. Our research shows that it is very likely that the permission that controlled occupancy was never implemented and the case could be closed as there was no breach of planning control as the dwelling is unfettered.

**E/2023/0061, Field to the west of The Vicarage, Loweswater, Cockermouth, CA13 0RU**

Alleged breach - siting of container

Reason for closure: No Breach - Immune (S171B)

We received concerns about a shipping container that had been sited on land in 2023. On contacting the land owner they informed us that they would be erecting a building on the land by the end of 2023 as approved by a 2021 application. A recent revisit has confirmed that the shipping container is in situ and the building as approved has still not be constructed. After a review of all the evidence it was concluded that the shipping container had been in situ since at least early 2021 and the development is now immune from enforcement action.

**E/2023/0089, Bordriggs Farm, Kendal Road, Bowness-on-windermere, Windermere, LA23 3HU**

Alleged unauthorised fences and building to house hot tubs and railings installed not in accordance with permissions 7/2022/5042 & 7/2022/5353 (additional railings and should be painted black ) and creation of separate self-contained holiday letting unit.  
Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

Unauthorised works had occurred to this grade II listed building including sub-division to create a new holiday letting dwelling, and external and internal alterations to the building. The breach of planning and listed building control have in the main been voluntarily resolved. Works to the building have been undone, including the sub-division. Two new wooden fences have not been removed but given the context it was considered not expedient to take any further action against them.

**E/2023/0167, Boaters Bar, Glebe road, Bowness-on-Windermere, LA23 3HE**

Alleged - Outside wooden terrace to rear has recently (2023) been extended  
Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

An existing area of raised decking to the rear of a craft bar has been extended in breach of planning control. An open sided shelter has also been erected on the decking. We considered that it is not expedient to take any further action. Both the decking and the shelter are acceptable in terms of appearance and they have a neutral impact of the amenity of the area.

**E/2024/0084, 33, Beck Nook, Staveley, Kendal, LA8 9ND**

Alleged construction of outbuilding in rear garden without planning permission  
Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

We received concerns about a new building that had been constructed without planning permission in a garden area to a domestic property. We initially considered that the building was permitted development but on further examination of the facts considered that whilst the building was constructed on land that now has a lawful use as domestic garden it is not within the domestic curtilage. This means the building cannot be permitted development. That said, we consider that the building is acceptable and it is not expedient to take further action.

**E/2024/0089, Denton Hill, Lowthwaite, Matterdale, Penrith, CA11 0LE**

Alleged breach of construction hours condition & siting of mobile home on open access land

Reason for closure: Other

The concerns raised in this case have, or are being, investigated under other case references E/2013/0067 and E/2025/0036.

**E/2024/0173, Thirlspot Farm, Thirlmere, Keswick, CA12 4TW**

Alleged creation of touring caravan campsite to the side of the hotel, laying of hardstanding for new pitches

Reason for closure: Breach - Retrospective permission

A small seasonal tented campsite has been extended into the adjoining field. The site now only accepts caravans. A material change of use has occurred in breach of planning control. A retrospective application was submitted and approved (ref 7/2025/2170). The breach of planning control has now been regularised.

**E/2024/0216, Rezillos Ices, 48a Main Street, Keswick, CA12 5JD**

Alleged construction of wooden structure to front of property

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

Our investigation found that a structure had been erected at 48a Main Street without planning permission. The structure did not benefit from permitted development and therefore a breach of planning control had occurred. Due to the canopy's appearance and materials, and its setting within Keswick Conservation Area, it was contrary to Local Plan policy and an enforcement notice for its' removal was issued on 29 January 2025. The canopy has now been removed in compliance with the notice and the breach resolved.

**E/2025/0032, The Grasmere Hotel, Broadgate, Grasmere, LA22 9TA**

Alleged installation of illuminated moving sign

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

A large advertisement was erected in the car park at the Grasmere Hotel, Grasmere. The advert was being displayed in contravention of the Advertisement Regulations. Following the issuing of a section 225A notice and subsequent withdrawal of an appeal, the advertisement has been removed.

**E/2025/0078, Land to the north of Greenbank/Castlefield, Ambleside, LA22 9BG**

Alleged engineering works - new drainage and bunds adjacent to garages and a new track in field

Reason for closure: No Breach - Permitted development

A concern was raised regarding alleged engineering works on land at Nook End Farm Ambleside to create a track and drainage system. Our investigation found that the repair of a farm track by way of laying of stone chippings on the ground had taken place. The laying of stone on the ground in this case is permitted development. There is no breach of planning control.

It is unclear whether the creation of the ditch in the field, to facilitate surface water runoff, is an act of development, but in any case, it would not be expedient to take action as it is small in scale and necessary for agriculture in the unit.

**E/2025/0094, Nook End Farm, Nook Lane, Ambleside, LA22 9BH**

Alleged unauthorised works - erection of shed and creation of road

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

A concern was raised regarding the alleged erection of a shed and creation of a road at Nook End Farm, Ambleside. The road was investigated under case ref E/2025/0078. In relation to the shed, on site inspection, our investigation found that a building had been re-erected following a fire.

The replacement building is in breach of planning control. However, it is not considered expedient to take action as the building replaces an existing building that was fire damaged. The development does not materially affect the character of the area nor does it have an unacceptable impact of the amenity of nearby residents.

**E/2025/0120, Satter Knotts, Far Sawrey, Ambleside, LA22 0LW**

Alleged potential engineering works in relation to planning permission 7/2024/5453

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

A concern was raised regarding alleged engineering works at Satter Knotts, Far Sawrey, Ambleside. On inspection at the site, construction works had started as part of planning permission 7/2024/5463 to demolish and erect a new dwelling with associated engineering works. Heras fencing was erected to protect the adjacent woodland but was not placed in the correct position and construction spoil/earth was also placed within the root protection areas and therefore, not in accordance with the arboricultural report. A breach of planning control had occurred. Following advice, the Heras fencing was placed in the correct position, and the spoil/earth was removed from the root protection areas. Therefore, the breach of planning control was resolved.

**E/2025/0185, Field west of Lake View Farm, Gramere, LA22 9TD**

To reinvestigate closed case E/2020/0015 following new allegations

Reason for closure: No Breach - Not development

It was alleged there had been a change of use of the land to a mixed use of agriculture and commercial wood processing and storage of building equipment and materials. Logs are being split and stored on site. A small amount of building equipment and materials are kept on site, but this appears incidental to the agricultural use. This activity is at a scale that is considered secondary to the primary use of the land and building for agricultural purposes and does not significantly change the character or function of the building to be considered material. An area of hardstanding close to the access gateway has been extended. The site is used for agricultural purposes and the development falls within permitted development. No breach of planning control has occurred.

**E/2025/0194, Flats 1-6 Old Norse, Compston Street, Ambleside, LA22 9FA**

Alleged breach of planning conditions relating to affordable housing (S106) - an increase of 40% on the monthly rent is causing considerable stress

Reason for closure: No Breach - Has permission/consent

It has been alleged that the proposed revised rental values for 1-4 Old Norse, Compston Street are not affordable as required by the S106 Agreement for permission 7/2006/5005. We have thoroughly investigated the concern. It is our understanding the new rents are to be applied against an existing tenancy or re-letting to an existing tenant, therefore the affordable rent formula as set out in Homes England guidelines applies. We consider the proposed new rental value of £740 is consistent with Homes England's affordable unit rent formula and is therefore in accordance with the terms in the S106 agreement. A modification of the S106 agreement is not required in relation to the rental values.

We advised the agent that approval of the Authority was required in regard to the new rental value and should be sought by writing to the Authority. A written request for approval was received, and the Authority approved the new rent to be applied.

### **E/2025/0198, Land at Heughscar Close, Pooley Bridge**

Car park in field

Reason for closure: No Breach - Permitted development

An agricultural field was used as a temporary car parking field for 28 days in 2025. We were notified of the intention to do this prior to the use by the agent to the landowner with dates of intended opening to comply with Schedule 2 Part 4 Class B of The Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 which would allow car-parking for up to 28 days without planning permission. Whilst we received complaints about the car-parking we did not receive any information that suggested the use had been anymore than the 28 days. Monitoring site visits also did not show the use of the land outside the 28 day allowance, There is no breach of planning control.

### **E/2025/0218, Land north of sewerage works, Kendal Road, Lindale, Grange over Sands, Cumbria, LA11 6QR**

Alleged - storage of cars on land granted permission for agricultural purposes

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

A concern was raised regarding the use of an area of agricultural land for the storage of vehicles adjacent to Kendal Road, Lindale. Our investigation found that the land was being used for the storage of vehicles. The lawful use of the land is agricultural and there is no planning permission granted for a change of use of the land. A breach of planning control has occurred. The landowner agreed to arrange for the removal of the vehicles and to restore the land for agricultural use only. A subsequent visit found that the vehicles have now been removed and the breach resolved.

**E/2025/0243, The Estate Office, The Bridge, Coniston, LA21 8HJ**

Alleged breach of planning condition regarding advertising signs, erection of cameras and replacement of traditional guttering and items placed on the footway outside the building

Reason for closure: No Breach - Not development

The concern we received related to a number of alterations to this building. We investigated the replacement of the main fascia sign in 2018 and found it benefitted from deemed consent. That same sign is still being displayed. The other concerns do not amount to development. No breach of advertisement or planning control has been identified.

**E/2025/0245, Grassgarth, Lyth, Kendal, Cumbria, LA8 8DG**

Alleged extension to kennels, erection of new kennels and associated buildings, stables, cabins, tracks and hard core areas. Change of use from agricultural land

Reason for closure: No Breach - Not development

A concern was raised regarding the alleged extension of kennels, erection of stables, formation of tracks and a change of use of land at Grassgarth Kennels, Lyth, Kendal. Our investigation found that there was no evidence of this on site. Therefore, there is no breach of planning control.

**E/2025/0247, 1 Mylnbeck, Lake Road, Windermere, LA23 2JD**

Alleged change of use from dwelling to holiday let. Erection of large sign

Reason for closure: Breach - Resolved

This dwelling is being occupied as a holiday let, but this has not resulted in a material change of use. Taking into account the facts in this case, for example the occupancy maximum of six people, it is considered that the use still falls within Use Class C3 - Dwellinghouse.

A sign advertising a holiday let company had been located on the gable of a garage immediately adjacent the A5074 road. Its size meant it did not benefit from deemed consent under the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007 (Regulations). We contacted the owner who subsequently removed the sign and replaced it with a new sign whose dimensions are in accordance with the Regulations and therefore acceptable.

#### **E/2025/0254, Holme Farm, Blindcrake, Cockermouth**

Replacement of chimney which is not in keeping with the Conservation Area

Reason for closure: Breach - Not expedient to enforce

A concern was received regarding the alleged installation of a chimney at Holm Farm, Blindcrake. Our investigation found that a chimney had been replaced on a small extension to the south facing elevation of the dwelling. The development has occurred without planning permission – a breach of planning control.

However, it is not considered expedient to take action as the development does not materially affect the distinctive character of the area nor does it have an unacceptable impact of the amenity of adjoining residents or users due to overlooking or other adverse impacts .
