# **INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING STATEMENT**

**2022/2023**

## **Section 106 Report Summary**



## 1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Community Infrastructure Levy (Amendment) (England) (No.2) Regulations 2019 require local authorities that receive contributions from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) or enter into section 106 planning obligations with developers to publish an Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) annually.
- 1.2 This statement will be produced annually by end of December each year, covering the financial year ending in the preceding March. **The Lake District National Park Authority has not adopted a Community Infrastructure Levy.** Developer contributions in the Lake District National Park are collected through Section 106 agreements. This statement provides information on the total revenue we received from developer contributions in 2022/23 along with the contributions we spent or allocated for spend, and the amounts we retained for future expenditure.
- 1.3 This summary report should be read in conjunction with the developer agreements contributions spreadsheet (csv) file which can be viewed on our website. Throughout the IFS there will be references to the following definitions:
- **Agreed** – contributions that have been agreed within a signed legal document. These contributions have not been collected/ delivered and if the planning applications are not implemented, they will never be received.
  - **Received** – contributions received, either non-monetary or monetary, that have been transferred to Lake District National Park Authority (the Authority).
  - **Allocated** – contributions that have been received and allocated to specific projects, or passed to a team within the authority to spend
  - **Spent/delivered** – monetary or non-monetary contributions that have been spent/ delivered.
  - **This financial year** – unless stated otherwise, this refers to the period 01/04/2022 – 31/03/2023

## 2. Developer Contributions - Section 106 Planning Obligations

2.1 A Section 106 Agreement is a legal agreement made under the provisions of Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, which sets out the requirements the planning authority and the applicant have agreed to. New housing and other developments impact on all our infrastructure, such as our schools, roads, health facilities and recreational space, and it is appropriate that developers can be required to help fund the new or improved infrastructure we will need because of it. The Authority uses Section 106 Agreements in a variety of ways, but primarily to secure a monetary contribution to finance infrastructure improvements required as a consequence of new development, and to secure the on-site provision of local affordable housing.

### Obligations entered in the financial year

2.2 As Table 1 outlines, there were no planning obligations entered into during the financial year that would provide a financial contribution.

2.3 Table 2 lists the non-monetary contributions to be provided under planning obligations which were entered into during the financial year. 2.10 During 2022-23 we spent £1655.40 on maintaining the public rights of way network within a two-mile radius of Limefitt Holiday Park in Troutbeck. £76.00 was spent on materials, the rest on staff time. Work included path strimming and replacement of ROW furniture (fingerposts).

2.11 During the financial year, no monies received under planning obligations was spent on repaying money borrowed. And no money was spent in respect of monitoring (including reporting under regulation 121A) in relation to the delivery of planning obligations.
