Introduction

1. The Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, Section 15, requires that Local Planning Authorities must prepare and maintain a document to be known as their Local Development Scheme. We are still awaiting secondary legislation to bring into force the Levelling Up and Regeneration Act 2023 (Schedule 7, 15B), which was enacted in 2023 and this will update the requirement to prepare and maintain a “local plan timetable”. This Local Development Scheme provides information on the Development Plan Documents that the Authority intends to produce and sets out the timetable for their production.
2. The Local Development Scheme (LDS) is designed to help the local community and all our partners interested in development and the use of land and buildings in the Lake District to understand what plans the Authority intend to produce.

What new Development Plan Documents are to be prepared?

Context

3. The plans and timetables addressed in this version of the LDS are based on the current plan-making system. The Levelling Up and Regeneration Act was given Royal Assent in November 2023, which proposes changes to the plan-making system. On 12th December 2024, Government confirmed a new National Planning Policy Framework, and also confirmed a transitional date for plans under the current plan-making system to be submitted of December 2026.

The Development Plan

4. Geographical coverage – Lake District National Park Authority boundary. Adoption – 19 May 2021.
5. The Local Plan 2020-2035 contains the strategic policies for the Lake District National Park, including for waste and minerals, and a number of local policies to manage development. It also includes land allocations to meet development needs for housing and employment. An interactive policies map supports the Local Plan.

6. Local Planning Authorities should review policies in their Local Plan to assess whether they need updating at least once every five years, and should then be updated as necessary. The review of the Local Plan is timetabled to commence in 2026.

Neighbourhood Plans

7. The 2011 Localism Act gave powers to local communities to produce their own, locally distinctive plans to guide development decisions in their localities. These are called Neighbourhood Plans. Neighbourhood Plans are produced and owned by the community, but they must be broadly consistent with the strategic policies within our Local Plan. Once Neighbourhood Plans are adopted they become part of the Development Plan for that area. This means that when we are making decisions over development proposals, the decision would be guided by the Local Plan and the relevant adopted Neighbourhood Plan.
8. There are a number of Neighbourhood Plans which have been adopted or are being prepared either wholly or partly within the Lake District National Park.

9. A range of **Supplementary Planning Documents** help to provide further detail on how the Local Plan's policies are implemented and applied in practice. They cover the geographical area of the Lake District National Park unless specified. Supplementary Planning Documents will be reviewed and added to the Local Development Scheme when they are identified as being required.

Design Code

10. The Lake District Design Code Supplementary Planning Document was adopted in September 2023. Its geographical coverage is the entire Lake District National Park. A design code sets out a number of design specifications for new developments in a simple, concise and illustrated way that is specific to an area. Members agreed to review a small number of sections of the Design Code in November 2024. The amendments have been subject to public consultation and Members will consider its adoption in March 2026.

Reuse of existing buildings (avoiding demolition)

11. It is our intention to prepare a new Supplementary Planning Document to help implement Local Plan Policy 06 (Design and Development) and resist the demolition of buildings which could be considered as non-designation heritage assets or components of an attribute of Outstanding Universal Value. Its geographical coverage will be the entire Lake District National Park.

Supporting documents

12. Preparation of local development documents are supported and guided by process documents, which are produced by us:

- An **Annual Monitoring Report** is produced each year to monitor the effectiveness of policies in the Local Plan.
- The **Statement of Community Involvement (SCI)** identifies key principles which we abide by when consulting and engaging communities during the preparation and review of the components of the Local Plan, other development plan documents and supporting documents. We adopted the Statement of Community Involvement in October 2022.

- The **Local Development Scheme** (this guide) establishes the scope of the Local Plan and the timescales for its production and review. Reviews are informed by regular monitoring of development and planning decisions, to assess the impacts of policies. We report on our key monitoring activity annually.

National Park Management Plan

13. Geographical coverage – Lake District National Park Authority boundary. Adoption – 20 October 2021.
14. The Lake District National Park Authority is required to produce a new Management Plan every five years. This Plan establishes the Vision for the Lake District. The Management Plan is being reviewed in 2025 with its adoption anticipated by October 2026.
