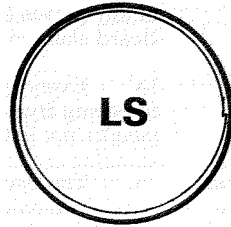

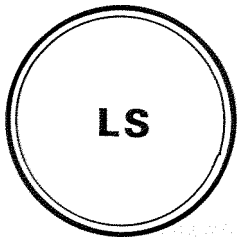

LAKE DISTRICT SPECIAL PLANNING BOARD

BYELAWS

FOR ACCESS LAND

made under section 90 sub-section (1) of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 by the Lake District Special Planning Board with respect to lands to which the public have been given access by an Agreement or Order or in consequence of acquisition.

Extent of Byelaws

1. These Byelaws shall, without prejudice to the exercise by any person of any lawful right or privilege, apply to the areas of land to which the public have been given access by an agreement or order or in consequence of acquisition and which are described in the Schedule to these Byelaws, and the said areas of land are hereafter in these Byelaws referred to as "the land".

Vehicles

2. No person shall without lawful authority ride or drive a mechanically-propelled vehicle or draw or push or cause to be drawn or pushed any trolley, trailer, cart or other wheeled vehicle (other than one used for the carriage of a child or children or an invalid) over the land except on a part of the land set out and made up for the parking of vehicles.

- Fires** 3. No person shall, so as to be likely to cause damage by fire to anything on the land, light any fire or stove or place or throw or let fall any lighted match or any substance or thing in among or near to grass, fern, heather, bushes or trees on the land.
- Dogs** 4. No person shall cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain on the land unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control, and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance or injury to any person and from worrying or disturbing any animal.
- Hunting & Shooting** 5. No person shall without lawful excuse or authority kill take molest or wilfully disturb any animal or bird or take or injure any egg or nest or engage in hunting or shooting or the setting of traps or the laying of snares.
- Carrying of Fire Arms** 6. No person shall without lawful authority have in his possession while he is on the land other than on any part thereof which is a public right of way any firearm unless it is so covered with a securely fastened gun cover that it cannot be fired.
In this Byelaw the expression "firearm" means any lethal barrelled weapon of any description from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged.
- Stone Rolling** 7. No person shall on the land wilfully, carelessly or negligently throw, roll or discharge any stone or other missile so as to cause, or to be likely to cause injury, danger or annoyance to any person, or injury, danger or molestation to any animal.
- Defacement** 8. No person shall deface, by writing or marking words or marks, any wall, fence, gate, tree or post on the land.
- Removal or Displacement of plants, stones etc** 9. No person shall without lawful authority remove or displace soil, plants, gravel, sand, clay, stone, minerals or any other substance on or from the land.
- Camping & caravanning** 10. No person shall on the land without lawful authority camp or erect a tent or use any vehicle including a caravan as sleeping accommodation or occupy such a vehicle overnight.
- Sale of Goods** 11. No person shall use or permit to be used any vehicle on the land for or in connection with the sale of any article or animal or other thing or the offer of any service for reward.
- Music, Wireless etc. Loud-speakers** 12. No person shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or operate or cause or suffer to be operated any wireless, loud-speaker, gramophone, amplifier or similar instrument on the land after having been requested to desist by any person, either personally or through a servant, or through a constable, on account of the disturbance of the ordinary pursuits of such person or for other reasonable and sufficient cause.

- Saving for Officers** 13. Any act necessary to the proper execution of his duty on the land by an officer of the Board or by any person or servant of any person employed by or acting with the authority of the Board shall not be deemed an offence against these Byelaws.
- Penalty** 14. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing Byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding FIFTY POUNDS.
- Repeal of Byelaws previously made** 15. The Byelaws for access land made by the Lake District Special Planning Board on the 21st January, 1976 and confirmed by the Secretary of State on 30th March 1976 are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE

Areas of land to which the public have been given access by an Agreement or Order or in consequence of acquisition.

1. **Tilberthwaite, Coniston.**
6.48 hectares of land at Tilberthwaite.
2. **Station Coppice, Thirlspot.**
1092 square metres of land on the west side of the A.591 at Thirlspot and lying between the road and Thirlmere.
3. **Bowness Point, Ennerdale.**
8.505 hectares of land at Bowness Point on the northern shore of Ennerdale Water.
4. **Gowbarrow, Ullswater.**
1.62 hectares of land lying between the road A.592 and the Lake, east of Gowbarrow Lodge, Ullswater.
5. **Penny Rock, Grasmere.**
27.45 hectares of land on the northern and southern sides of the A.591 between Grasmere Lake and Rydal Water.
6. **Stanley Ghyll, Eskdale.**
3.645 hectares of land at Stanley Ghyll, Eskdale.

19. **Winder Intake, Ambleside.**
10.6 hectares on the eastern side of Loughrigg Fell above Loughrigg Brow, Ambleside.
20. **Birk Hagg Wood, Rydal.**
14.0 hectares of woodland north of Rydal Hall.
21. **Trough House Bridge, Eskdale.**
0.52 hectares of land at Trough House Bridge near to Dalegarth Hall, Eskdale.
22. **Coniston.**
2.000 hectares adjoining Coniston Boating Centre on the west shore of Coniston Water between Church Beck and Yewdale Beck.
23. **Meathop.**
3.439 hectares of woodland situated on the west side of Meathop Road in the village of Meathop.
24. **Rusland.**
16.167 hectares of woodland at Yewbarrowdale situated on the east side of the minor road leading from Ellerside to Rusland.
25. **Eskdale.**
0.168 hectares situated on the north side of the Eskdale Valley road at Beckfoot Bridge.
26. **Caldbeck and Uldale Commons.**
4555.30 hectares on the north side of Skiddaw Forest.
27. **Barf, Thornthwaite.**
89.034 hectares on the west side of Bassenthwaite Lake adjoining Whinlatter Forest.
28. **Lords Waste, Dacre.**
0.142 hectares adjoining Dacre Low Bridge.
29. **Pinfold, Pooley Bridge.**
0.010 hectares on the roadside between Mains House and Pooley Bridge.
30. **Bassenthwaite Lake.**
520 hectares including lake, lakeshore and land at Bark Point on the north west shore.
7. **Windermere Islands.**
Nine islands in Windermere known as Thompson's Holme (0.899 hectares), Haws Holme (200.86 square metres), Lilies of the Valley, west (1658.62 square metres), Lilies of the Valley, east (1984.60 square metres), Crow Holme (1942 square metres), Maiden Holme (40.128 square metres), Ling Holme (639.54 square metres), Grassholme (805.068 square metres), and Silver Holme (525.844 square metres).
8. **Stickle Tarn, Langdale.**
Stickle Tarn, Langdale and the surrounding strip of land approximately 9.14 metres wide.
9. **Torver Commons.**
856.17 hectares of land including Torver High Common, Torver Low Common, Torver Back Common and Torver Common Wood.
10. **Calder Valley Woodlands.**
8.22 hectares of woodland in the Calder Valley including Rookery Wood, Chapelholme Wood, Brigholme Wood and Crake Nest Wood.
11. **Old Brown Howe, Coniston.**
2.09 hectares of land on the east side of the Torver to Greenodd road A.5084 lying between the road and Coniston Lake.
12. **Blawith Fell.**
672.70 hectares, including water known as Beacon Tarn, comprising part of the Blawith Fell near Coniston.
13. **Wood End, Thornthwaite.**
25.32 hectares of land situated on both the east and west sides of the A.66 road at Thornthwaite, Keswick.
14. **Ghyll Head, Windermere.**
4.11 hectares of land on the north side of the Ghyll Head to Cartmel Fell road at Ghyll head.
15. **High Dam, Finsthwaite.**
32.4 hectares of water known as High Dam together with the adjoining woodland in the Parish of Finsthwaite having an area of 32 hectares.
16. **Ludderburn Moss, Cartmel Fell.**
22.02 hectares of rough fell and woodland known as High Ludderburn Moss and Green Hills on the east side of the Ghyll Head to Cartmel Fell Road.
17. **Blea Brows, Coniston.**
4.02 hectares of land situated between Blawith Common and Coniston Water on the west shore of the Lake.
18. **Glenridding Common.**
1080 hectares including Greenside, Brown Cove, Keppel Cove, Striding Edge, Swirral Edge and the site of the former Greenside Lead Mines.
