

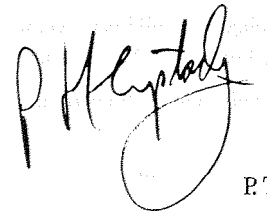
Byelaws for Car Parking

made under section 90 sub-section (1) and (5) of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 by the Lake District National Park Authority with respect to lands owned or occupied as parking places.

INTERPRETATION

1 In these byelaws:

“the Authority” means the Lake District National Park Authority;

“the land” means each of the areas of land owned or occupied by the Authority for the provision of parking places, and which are described in the Schedule to these byelaws.

VEHICLES

2 (1) No person shall, without reasonable excuse, ride or drive a cycle, motor cycle, motor vehicle or any other mechanically propelled vehicle on the land, or bring or cause to be brought on to the land a motor cycle, motor vehicle, trailer or any other mechanically propelled vehicle (other than a cycle), except on any part of the land which has been set apart by the Authority for the parking of vehicles.

(2) If the Authority has set apart a space on the land for use by vehicles of any class, this byelaw shall not prevent the riding or driving of those vehicles in the space so set apart, or on a route, indicated by signs placed in conspicuous positions, between it and the entrance to the land.

(3) This byelaw shall not extend to invalid carriages.

(4) In this byelaw:

“cycle” means a bicycle, a tricycle, or a cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case a motor cycle or motor vehicle;

“invalid carriage” means a vehicle, whether mechanically propelled or not, the unladen weight of which does not exceed 150 kilograms, the width of which does not exceed 0.85 metres and which has been constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of one person, being a person suffering from some physical defect or disability and is used solely by such a person;

“motor cycle” means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being an invalid carriage, with less than four wheels and the weight of which unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms;

“motor vehicle” means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being an invalid carriage, intended or adapted for use on roads;

“trailer” means a vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle, and includes a caravan.

VEHICLE LICENCES

3 (1) The driver shall not permit a vehicle to wait on the land, unless there is fixed to and exhibited on the vehicle a current licence for that vehicle.

(2) This byelaw shall not apply to any vehicle exempted from duty by or under any enactment.

LIMIT ON WAITING

1 The driver shall not permit a vehicle to wait on the land for more than 24 hours at any one time, unless the conditions displayed in accordance with byelaw 5 below provide otherwise.

29 Seathwaite (Dunnerdale)

836 square metres of land on the north west side of the unclassified road at Seathwaite, Dunnerdale, opposite the Church.

30 Thirlspot (Station Coppice)

799.8 square metres of land on the west side of the A591 road at Thirlspot and lying between the road and Thirlmere, and to the south of land over which the public have a right of access.

31 Thornthwaite (Powter Howe)

0.36 hectares of land lying adjacent to the Swan Hotel, Thornthwaite.

32 Thornthwaite (Woodend Brow)

0.35 hectares of land adjacent to A66, west of Hurst Hole Point.

33 Threlkeld (Blease Fell)

750 square metres of land lying adjacent to track at foot of Blease Fell, north of Blencathra Centre.

34 Threlkeld (Former Station)

0.10 hectares of land adjacent to B5322 and the former station site.

35 Threlkeld (Dickney)

0.29 hectares of and lying to the north east of Blease Road, Threlkeld between Sunnybank and Knott Allan.

36 Underbarrow (Scout Scar)

0.60 hectares of land on the north side of the Kendal Underbarrow Road at Scout Scar.

37 Ullswater (Gowbarrow)

368 square metres of land situated on the south side of the A592 road at Gowbarrow.

38 Waterhead (Ambleside)

0.96 hectares of land on the north side of the Waterhead Hotel, Ambleside and lying between the A591 road and the A5074 road.

39 Windermere (Beech Hill)

0.28 hectares of land on the south side of the Beech Hill Hotel, Windermere and lying between the A592 road and the Lake.

40 Windermere (Hammarbank)

0.405 hectares of land on the west side of the A592 road at Hammarbank, Windermere.

14 Glenridding

1.53 hectares of land between Glenridding Beck and Greenside Road on the west side of the A592 road at Glenridding.

15 Grasmere (Broadgate Meadow)

0.45 hectares of land at Broadgate Meadow, Grasmere on the east side of the B5287 road leading from Grasmere Village to White Bridge.

16 Grasmere (Stock Lane)

0.22 hectares of land on the north side of the B5287 road leading from Town End to Grasmere Village and forming part of Grasmere Sports Field.

17 Hawkshead

1.56 hectares of land on the north and east sides of the B5285 road in Hawkshead Village.

18 Hartsop (Cow Bridge)

0.31 hectares of land west of the A592 road at Cow Bridge, Hartsop.

19 Kirkstone Pass (Summit)

0.538 hectares of land situated on both sides of the A592 road at The Kirkstone Pass Inn.

20 Kirkstone (Red Pit)

0.23 hectares of land on the west side of the A592 road on Kirkstone Pass.

21 Langdale (New Dungeon Ghyll)

0.1 hectares of land on the south east side of the B5343 road at the junction with the old road opposite the New Dungeon Ghyll Hotel, Langdale.

22 Lamplugh (Felldyke)

620 square metres of land north of Folly Row, Felldyke, Lamplugh, adjacent to the highway.

23 Newlands (Chapel Bridge)

140 square metres of land adjacent to the minor road south-west of Little Town.

24 Pooley Bridge (Dunmallard)

0.12 hectares of land immediately north of the bridge over the River Eamont on the west shore of the river at Pooley Bridge.

25 Pooley Bridge (Eusemere)

0.23 hectares of land situated on the east side of Eusemere Lodge, Pooley Bridge.

26 Ravenglass

0.578 hectares of land, known as Butcher's Field, west of Ravenglass Railway Station in the village of Ravenglass.

27 Rydal (Pelter Bridge)

0.28 hectares of land south of the River Rothay and west of Pelter Bridge, Rydal.

28 Silecroft

1.12 hectares of land adjacent to the sea shore, Silecroft.

PARKING TICKETS

- 5 No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked on the land unless there is exhibited thereon a ticket issued in accordance with the Authority's conditions for the time being in force and displayed on a notice to that effect on the land.

LIABILITY OF VEHICLE OWNER IN RESPECT OF CAR PARKING CHARGES

- 6 For the purposes of the institution of proceedings in respect of the offence of failure to comply with Byelaw 5 it shall be conclusively presumed (notwithstanding that that person may not be an individual) that the owner of the vehicle was the driver of the vehicle at the relevant time and, accordingly, that acts or omissions of the driver of the vehicle at that time were his acts or omissions.

CAMPING

- 7 No person shall on the land, without the consent of the Authority, erect a tent or use any vehicle, including a caravan, or any other structure for the purpose of camping, except on any area which may be set apart and indicated by notice as a place where camping is permitted.

FIRES

- 8 (1) No person shall on the land intentionally light a fire, or place, throw or let fall a lighted match or any other thing so as to be likely to cause a fire.
- (2) This byelaw shall not prevent the lighting or use of a properly constructed camping stove or cooker in any area set aside for the purpose, in such a manner as not to cause danger of or damage by fire.

TRADING

- 9 No person shall on the land, without the consent of the Authority, sell, or offer or expose for sale, or let to hire, or offer or expose for letting to hire, any commodity or article.

NOISE

- 10 (1) No person on the land shall, after being requested to desist by an officer of the Authority, or by any person annoyed or disturbed, or by any person acting on his behalf:
- (a) by shouting or singing;
- (b) by playing a musical instrument; or
- (c) by operating or permitting to be operated any radio, gramophone, amplifier, tape recorder or similar instrument; cause or permit to be made any noise which is so loud or so continuous or repeated as to give reasonable cause for annoyance to other persons on the land.
- (2) This byelaw shall not apply to any person holding or taking part in any entertainment held with the consent of the Authority.

DOGS ON LEADS

- 11 (1) This byelaw does not apply to any roads within the land for the time being designated under section 27 of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
- (2) This byelaw does not apply in respect of any dogs to which section 1 of the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 applies.
- (3) Notice of the effect of this byelaw shall be given by signs placed in conspicuous positions on or at the entrances to the land.
- (4) For the purpose of this byelaw the keeper of the dog shall be deemed in charge thereof, unless at the time when the dog was present on the land it had been placed in or taken into the charge of some other person.
- (5) In paragraph (4) above, "the keeper" shall include the owner of the dog or any person who habitually has it in his possession.
- (6) Every person in charge of a dog on the land shall, as far as reasonably practicable, comply with a direction given by any Ranger or other officer of the Authority to keep the dog on a lead.
- (7) A direction under paragraph (6) above may only be given if such restraint is reasonably necessary to prevent a nuisance or behaviour by the dog likely to cause annoyance or disturbance to any person on the land or the worrying or disturbance of any animal or bird.

OBSTRUCTION

- 12 No person shall on the land:
 - (a) intentionally obstruct any officer of the Authority in the proper execution of his duties;
 - (b) intentionally obstruct any person carrying out an act which is necessary to the proper execution of any contract with the Authority; or
 - (c) intentionally obstruct any other person in the proper use of the land, or behave so as to give reasonable grounds for annoyance to other persons on the land.

SAVINGS

- 13 (1) An act necessary to the proper execution of his duty on the land by an officer of the Authority, or any act which is necessary to the proper execution of any contract with the Authority, shall not be an offence under these byelaws.
- (2) Nothing in or done under any of the provisions of these byelaws shall in any respect prejudice or injuriously affect any public right of way through the land or the rights of any person acting legally by virtue of some estate, right or interest in, over or affecting the land or any part thereof.

PENALTY

- 14 Any person offending against any of these byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

REVOCATION

- 15 The byelaws made by the Lake District Special Planning Board on 25 April 1986 and confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on 1 July 1986 relating to car parks are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Areas of land owned or occupied by the Authority for the provision of parking places.

- 1 **Bassenthwaite (Ouse Bridge)**
0.81 hectares of land on the north west shore of Bassenthwaite Lake lying between the B5291 road and the Lake.
- 2 **Bassenthwaite (Peel Wyke)**
230 square metres of land at Peel Wyke Harbour.
- 3 **Borrowdale (Grange Craggs)**
720 square metres of land situated on the east side of the B5289 road at Grange Craggs, Borrowdale.
- 4 **Brockhole Car Park**
0.96 hectares of land forming the public car parking area at the National Park Centre, Brockhole.
- 5 **Buttermere**
0.44 hectares of land in the Village Square, Buttermere together with a narrow strip of land running eastwards from the Square for a distance of approximately 110 metres.
- 6 **Caldbeck (Village Green)**
0.266 hectares of land situated on part of Caldbeck Green.
- 7 **Coniston (Ruskin Avenue)**
0.28 hectares of land on the south west side of Ruskin Avenue, Coniston.
- 8 **Coniston (Monk Coniston)**
0.28 hectares of land lying between the road and the lake on the north eastern shore of Coniston Water.
- 9 **Coniston (Old Brown Howe)**
919 square metres of land on the west side of the A5084 Torver to Greenodd Road A5084 lying between the road and Coniston Lake.
- 10 **Coniston (Old Station)**
0.24 hectares of land situated on the former station site at Coniston.
- 11 **Coniston (Boating Centre)**
Two areas of respectively 0.19ha and 0.086ha at Coniston Boating Centre and adjacent to the Bluebird Cafe.
- 12 **Eskdale (Trough House Bridge)**
360 square metres of land north of Stanley Ghyll.
- 13 **Finsthwaite (High Dam)**
0.14 hectares of land in High Dam Wood, Finsthwaite, including the access road to the car park from the Finsthwaite to Graythwaite Road.
